Re: Drug-Specific Costs in the Proposed Out-Of-Pocket (OOP) Cost Comparison Tool for the Federally-facilitated Marketplaces (FFMs)

Dear Director Counihan:

We, the undersigned 103 patient, provider, and consumer organizations listed below, are writing this letter to strongly encourage the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) to include accurate drug-specific out-of-pocket (OOP) costs in the proposed OOP cost estimator under development for the federally facilitated marketplace for the 2016 enrollment period. The success of the marketplaces will only be fully realized if people with chronic diseases and disabilities and their family caregivers have access to tools that enable them to make properly informed purchasing decisions.

We are pleased that CMS is moving forward to build and launch a tool so shoppers can compare expected OOP costs in exchange plans. This is an enormous step forward to helping people select the right plan for them.

To better assist exchange plan shoppers who rely on medications to treat their health needs, this calculator must: 1) reflect real formularies with coverage and tier placement information, 2) allow patients to enter their medicines, and 3) use approximate negotiated prices of these drugs. The Medicare Plan Finder has long included this capability and accuracy of formulary information, and demonstrates the agency's ability to deliver patient-centered tools that can help beneficiaries make appropriate health plan choices.

The out-of-pocket expenses that people experience in exchange plans can be a determining factor in whether they are able to access necessary care. And, since so many patients rely on medications to manage their conditions, accurate information about expected out-of-pocket costs for drugs is a key factor for making a good plan enrollment decision. Without specific support tools to help them pick a plan that meets both their health and budget needs, enrollees will continue to be forced to select plans based primarily on premium costs.

We understand the complexity of building a tool that meets the varied needs of the heterogeneous patient population. Should CMS not be able to build a robust calculator for the 2016 enrollment period, we believe it is imperative for you to incorporate accurate drug information into the 2017 calculator. In the meantime, we would urge you to link to other OOP calculators utilizing drug costs, such as www.PuttingPatientsFirst.net.

For patients to adequately compare costs for available exchange plans, they need access to a tool that assists in the calculation of all expected out-of-pocket costs, including medications, across an entire plan year.
